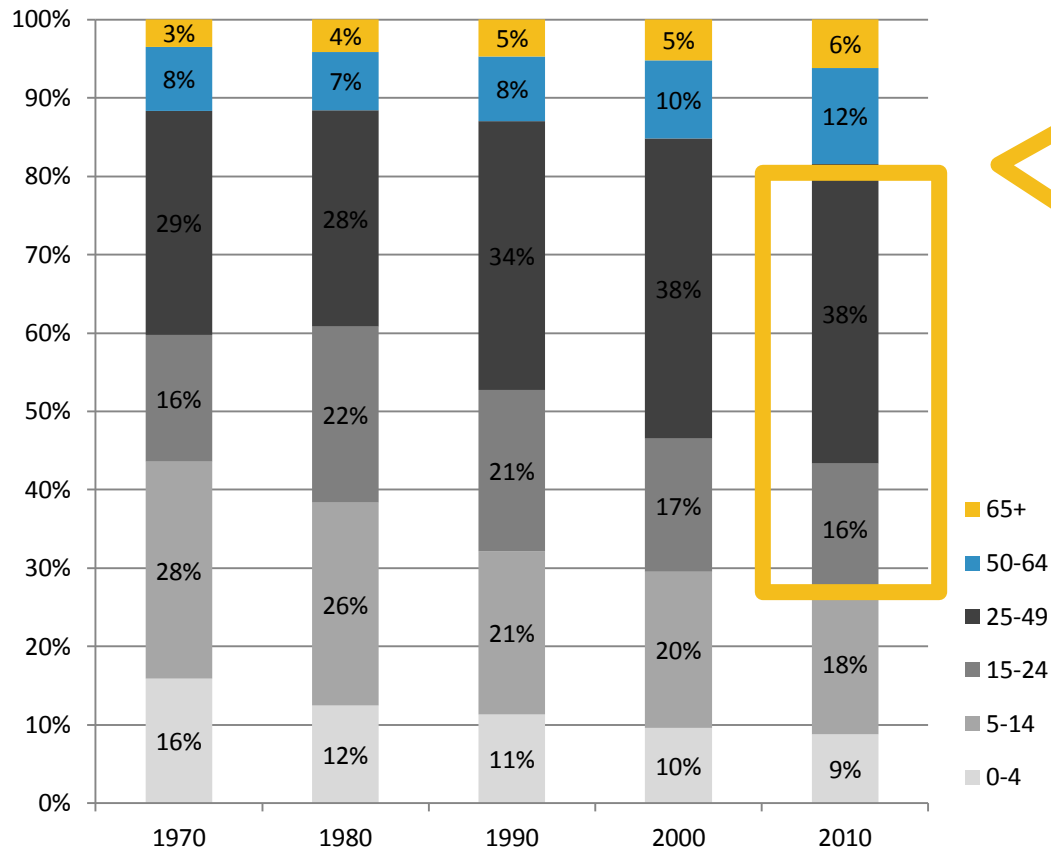

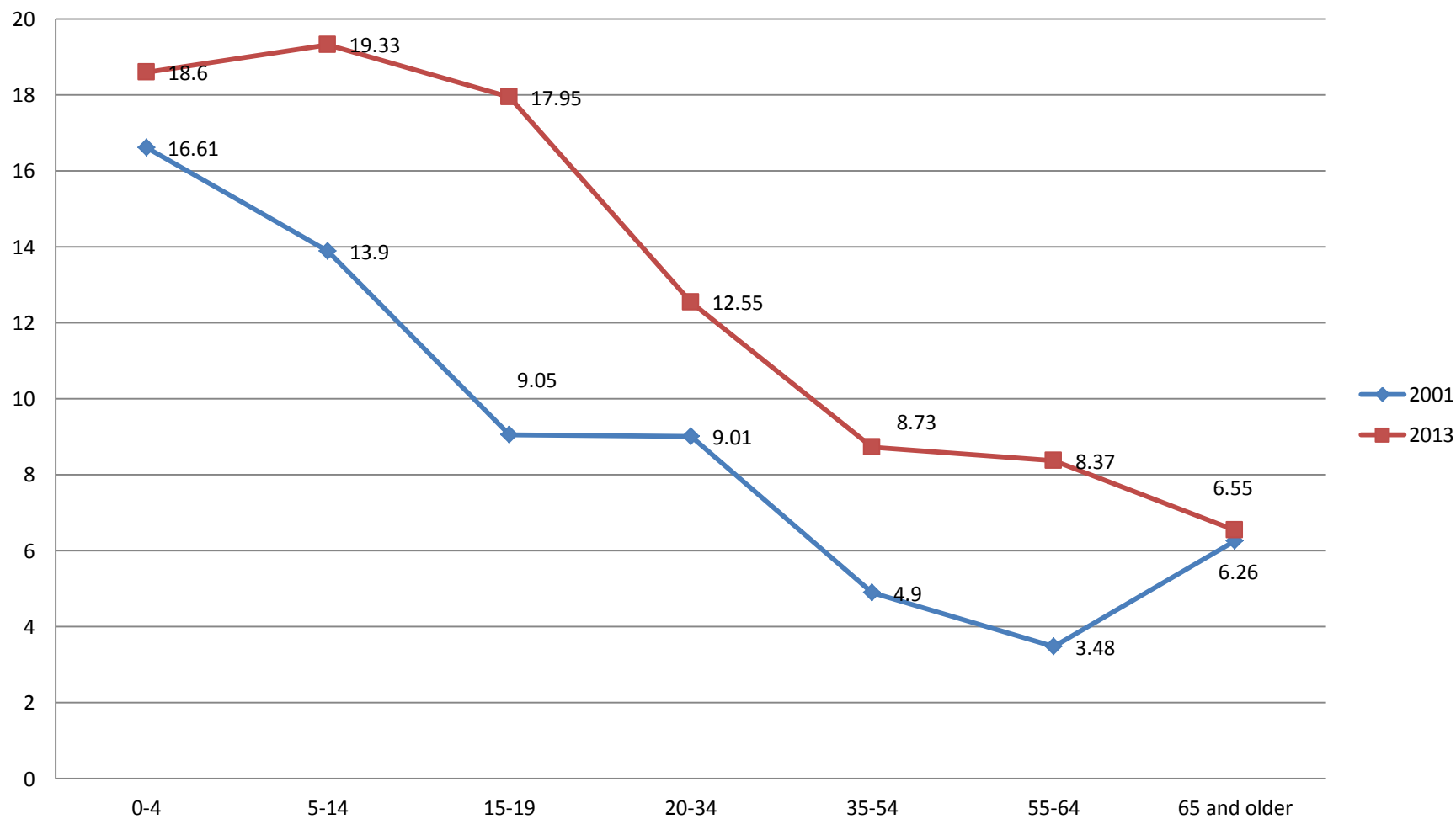

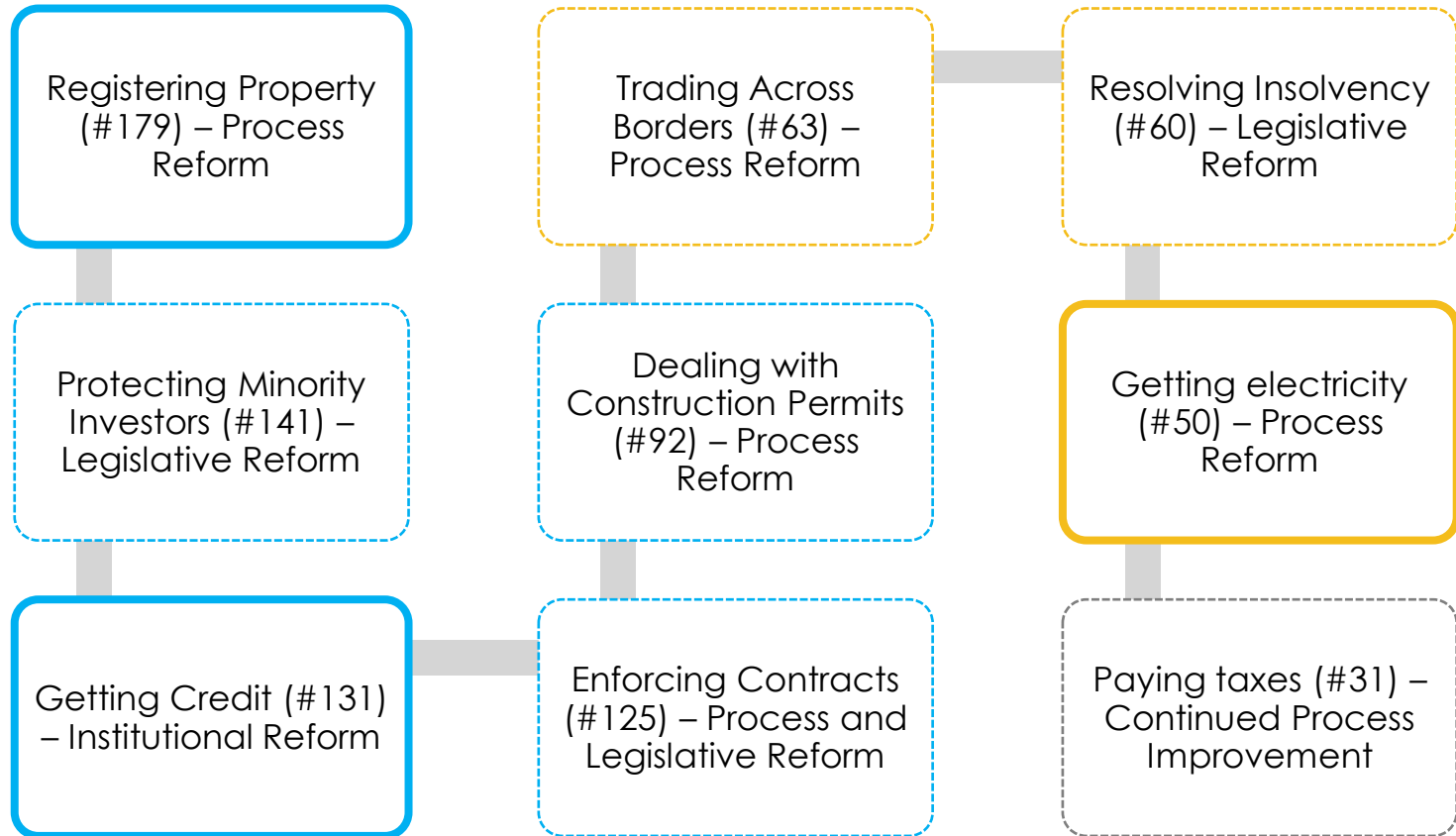

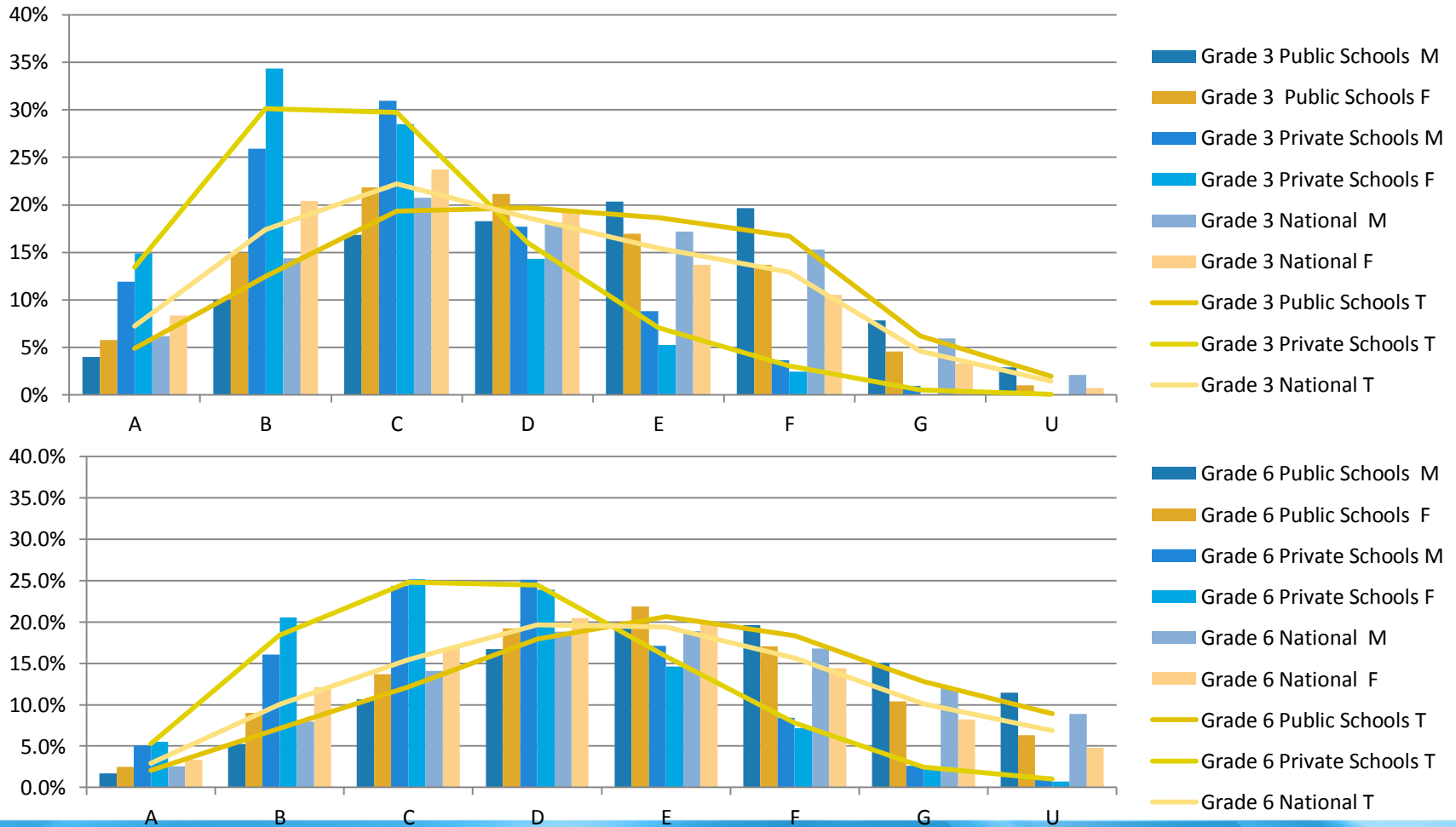

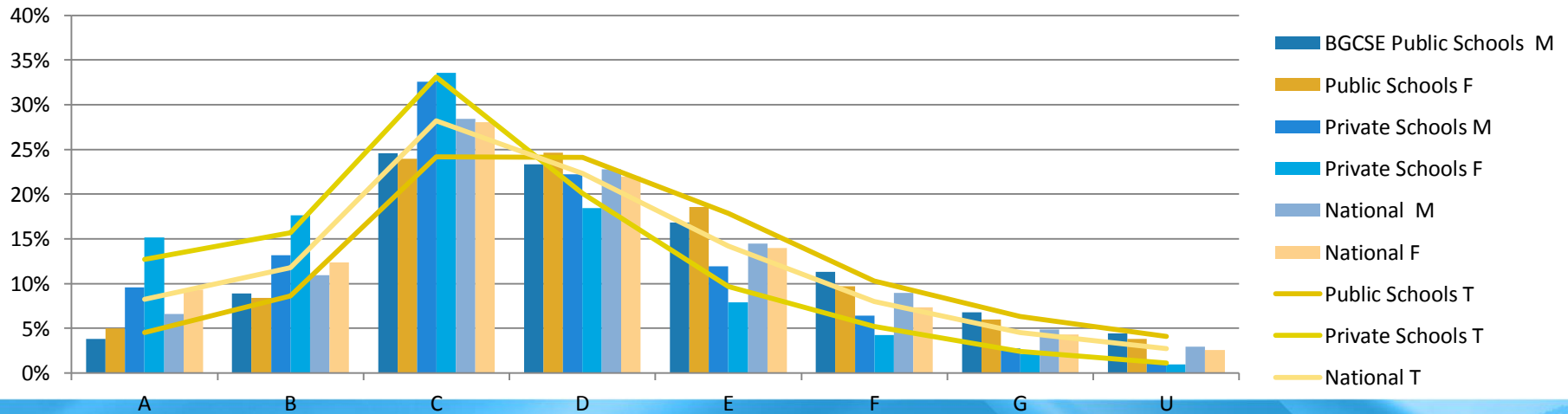

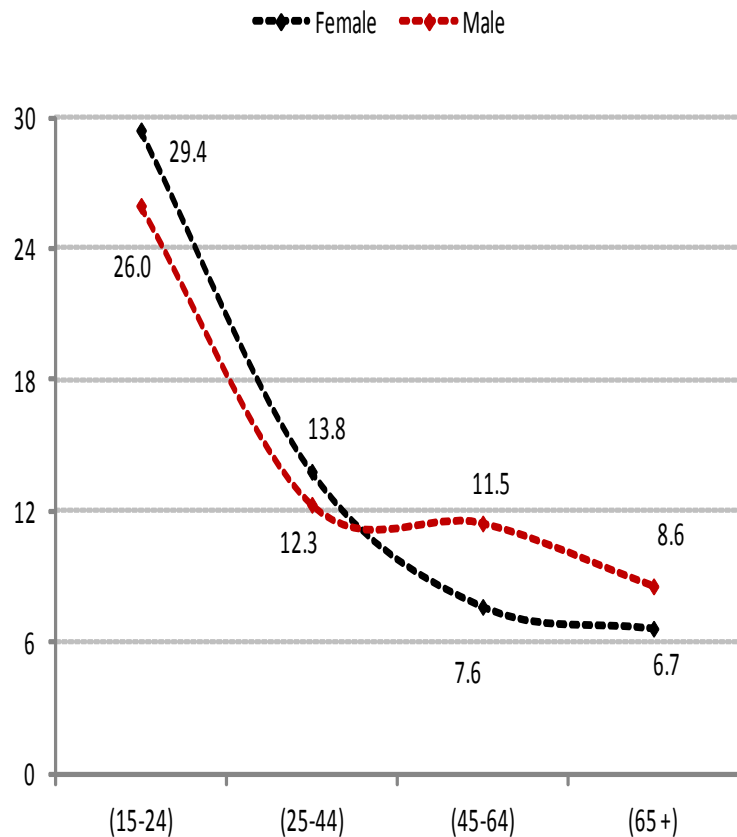
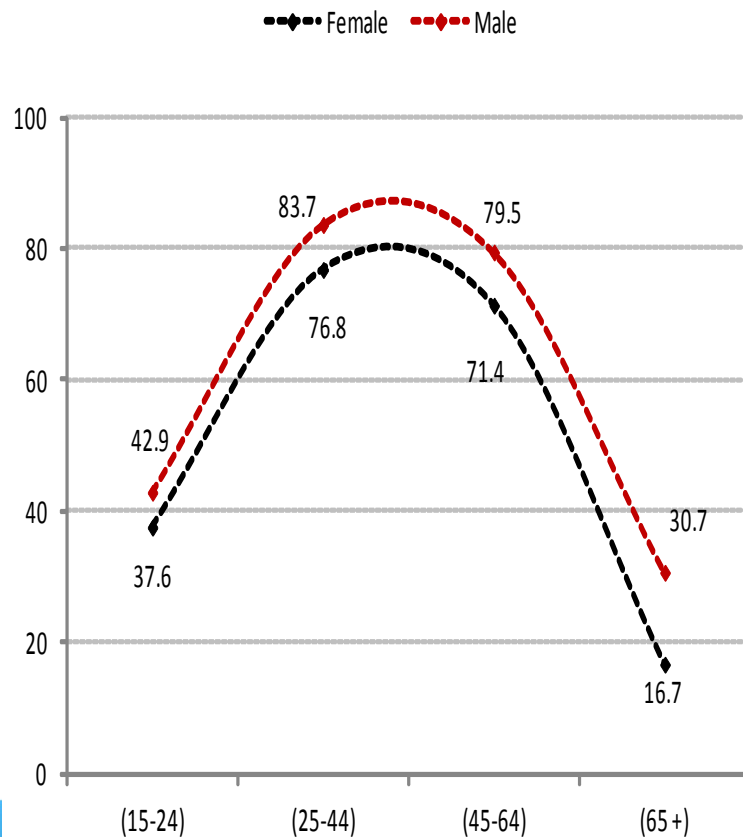

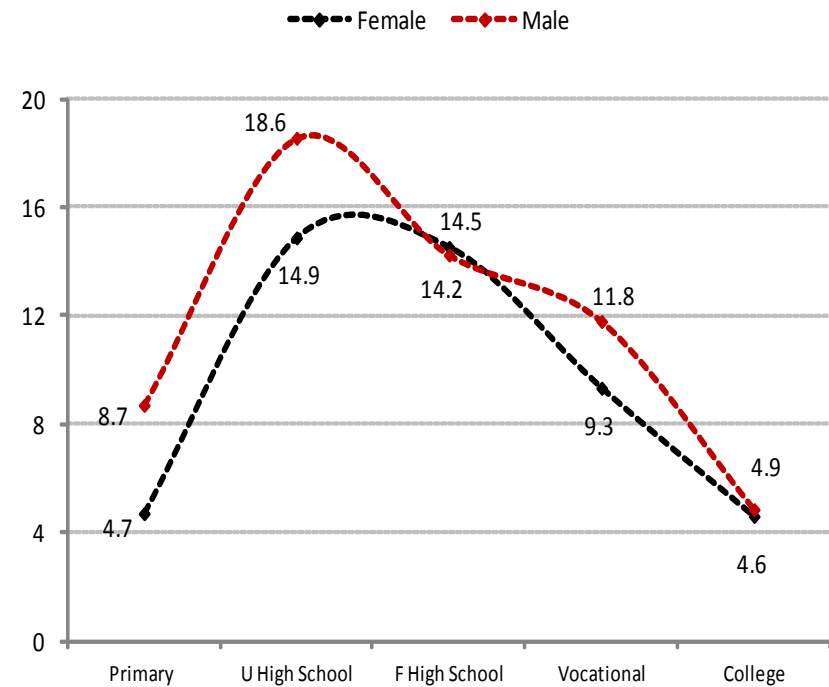
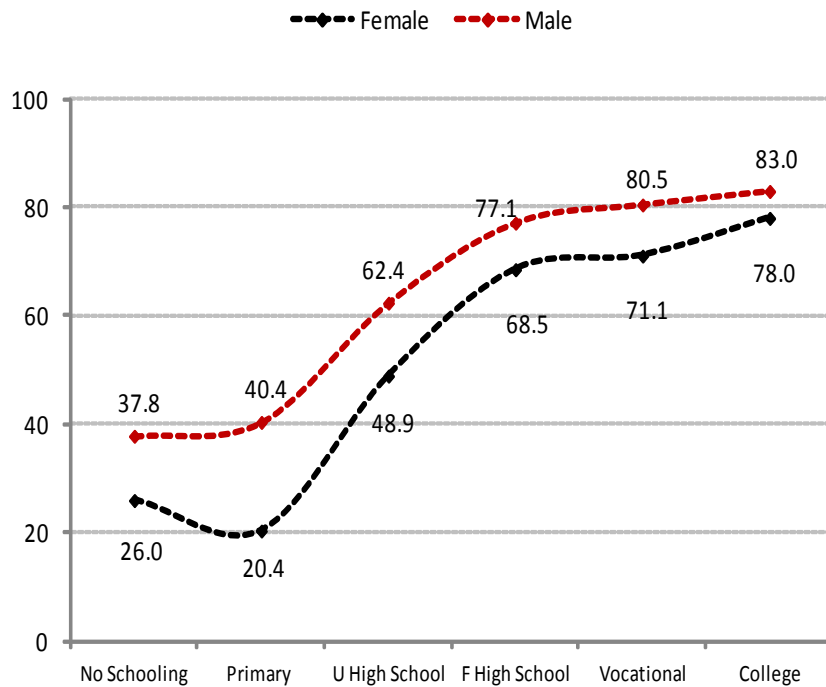
Labour Market Issues: Age

Employment and Unemployment Rates by Age and Gender



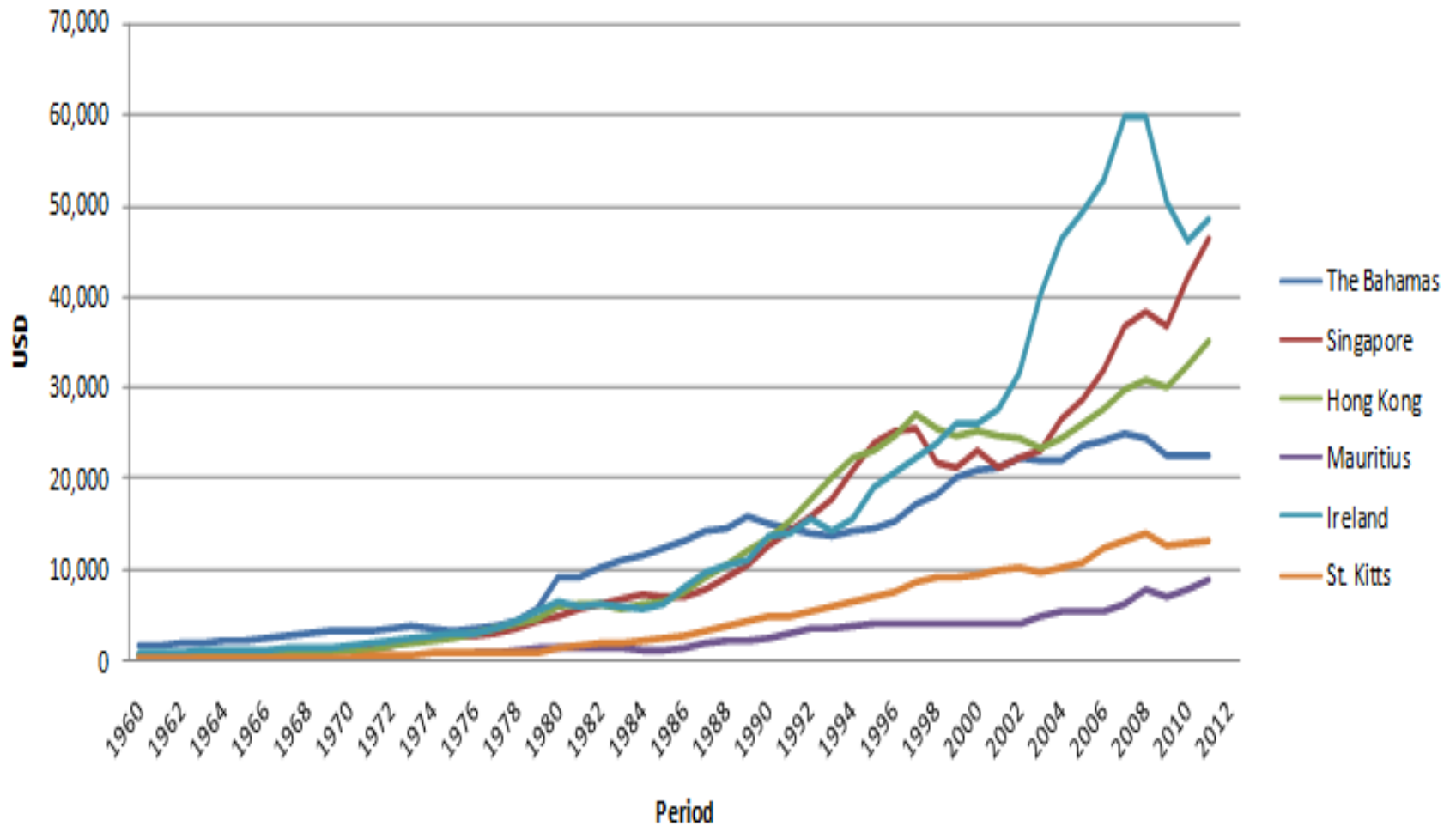
